Why I Wrote The Crucible [excerpt] SYNOPSIS: Arthur Miller wrote The Crucible in 1952 largely in response to McCarthyism The Crucible is set in Salem, Massachusetts, in 1692 Rumors of witchcraft throughout the town lead to accusations, roundups, and forced confessions Eventually the innocent were sent to the gallows Miller compared

The Crucible • Arthur Miller was inspired to write The Crucible not only because of his knowledge of the Salem Witch Trials of 1692, but he was also inspired by the "McCarthyism" era of the 1950s • The Crucible is an allegory, meaning it is a story told on two levels -On one level, it's a story about the Salem Witch Trials of 1692

In Arthur Miller's *The Crucible*, Danforth, chief jurist in the Salem witch trials, admonishes: But you must understand, sir, that a person is either with this court or he must be counted against it, there be no road between This is a sharp time, now, a precise time-we live no longer in the dusky
